We give thanks for all the amazing work that has been done under his leadership, and pray that God would continue to lead him in the exiting new season. As Peter steps aside into a time of rest, call upon God to bless Peter and his family. Pray also for Peter's successor as they take on the role of CEO shortly, that God will bless this new ministry, to build on the work Prison Fellowship does for those who are in the prison system as offenders.

There is also a need for support for Abel, the lab technician, as more tests are being required now that the clinic has a CBC machine and this will increase when full maternity care is in place.

For wisdom and provision for the next phase of development towards providing full maternity services. A placenta pit and an incinerator are still required.

Reliable electricity when the solar panels are not effective due to rain or darkness is a priority as there are no effective batteries to store the solar power. Please pray for a wise solution to this problem which is affordable.

Annie and Dan lead 'Tek Ura' working with the poor and marginalised in Tirana and Durrës. The community centres provide healthcare, education, welfare support and Christian faith communities.

What does it mean for everyone to be included? - One of the questions guiding us throughout our recent week-long summer camp in Durrës. Inclusion presents challenges, but also brings immense joy and growth for all involved. Our commitment to the principle of 'belong before you believe' was central to this camp, where we also welcomed children with autistic needs, including a special child, 'N', who thrived with our one -to-one support.

Reflecting on the camp, for many, the highlight was simply the sense of community: "when we all share and do things together." The week's theme of peace-making led us to ask important questions: are we prepared to commit to staying and loving our community? Are we willing to commit to loving and working on relationships? Can we discard useless stereotypes and build a flourishing community together with God?

It was a real blessing to see more than 100 smiling faces singing, dancing, painting, praising, doing all-ability sports and water games, eating, drinking, making sand castles on the beach and making



really positive community memories together. It's amazing to think that our centre in Durrës is still only in the second year and we can celebrate such growth.
